When seeking admission to the United States, the following classifications may be eligible for a grace period of up to 10 days before, and up to 10 days after the petition validity period: CW-1, E-1, E-2, E-3, H-1B, H-2B, H-3, L-1A, L-1B, O-1, O-2, P-1, P-2, P-3, TN-1, and TN-2. H-2A nonimmigrants may be eligible for a grace period of up to one week before and 30 days after the petition validity period. If provided at admission, this grace period will be annotated on the beneficiary's I-94 by Customs and Border Protection (CBP). The grace period is a period of authorized stay but does not provide the beneficiary authorization to work beyond the petition validity period. The petitioner should keep the upper portion of this notice and forward the lower portion to the worker(s) for presentation at the U.S. Consulate.

If any of the named worker(s) will apply for a visa at a consulate other than the one listed above, the petitioner should file Form I-824, Application for Action on an Approved Application or Petition, to request us to notify the new consulate.

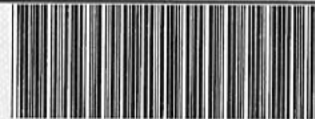
